DAILY DEVOTIONAL

While I was reading 1 Samuel, chapters 8-10 and 15-16, I found myself reflecting on my own life. In chapter 8 we see Saul get handpicked by God to be the king over his people. After Saul is anointed, Samuel tells him of all these things that will happen to him after he departs from Samuel and how he should react to



each situation. This experience was to shape Saul into a new man, fit to rule. When I apply this to my own life, I think of the days following my baptism. I was happy that I had given my life to Jesus, but I

was a bit lost as to what I should be doing next. God started to show me opportunities where I could share my knowledge with others whether that be through my words or actions. This seemed to happen to Saul as well in chapter 15, when he got lost in worldly things and was ultimately rejected as king.

Sometimes it is easy to find myself becoming too distracted with the things of this world and I begin to reject God from my life. I start to worry about things that didn't worry me before and I start to take matters into my own hands and leave God out.

When this happens, the great thing is that we can choose to be God's chosen again and ask Him to take control again. He handpicked each of us, not caring what we looked like or what other people said about us, just as He did with David in chapter 16.

It gives me comfort and a purpose when I think of the fact that I was chosen by God to go out and share my knowledge in hopes of bringing others closer to Him.

Damian Chandler

Pastor Damian Chandler was born in Toronto, Canada, and raised on the island of Barbados. For as long as he can remember church has always been a part of his life. From children's choirs to kids' camps, his path always led him back to the church. But it was a small church, housed in the basement of his home, that made the greatest impact on his life.

With only nine members, there was no way to escape leadership...or for that matter church attendance. He tells the story of one day trying to skip church, pretending to be sick. When all of a sudden, the door of his room swung open and a member dragged him downstairs to church... in his paiamas. He knew those nine members loved him deeply and he loved them. And somewhere in that community his love for Jesus grew. At night he could hear the prayers of these humble people rising through the vents into his room. That small church made a large deposit in the spiritual hunger of Pastor Chandler, and it stands as both a turning point in his life, and a foundation for his call

His pastoral journey started in Seattle Washington. While there he founded Impact Youth, an urban youth ministry that used the arts to help teens find Jesus in their




Safety and Main Stage Seating Tips


- 1. Have at least one adult at your campsite at all times.

All unattended items left will be taken to Lost and Found or thrown away. Portable chairs are strongly recommended. People on tarps cannot see as well and take up a lot of space.

Number of people needed: 15,000 Pathfinders, age does not matter. Each participant must be in their Pathfinder uniform. Schedule: Sabbath morning, immediately following

the Worship Service on Main Stage

Location: Back of audience seating from Main Stage

Largest Pathfinder Scarf and Slide:

We are making a Yellow Pathfinder Scarf that is 300 feet from tip to tip and 150 feet from front to back tip. The slide will be in proportion to match. On Sabbath morning, depending on the wind and weather, we will display the scarf, either by picking up the scarf with a crane (it will weigh about 800 pounds), or by having Pathfinders walk in with it to display during the Investiture Program. Much of the sewing will take place right on the Camporee grounds so come by and see this World Record being made right in front of you!



THE BIG IDAHO® POTATO TRUCK VISITS OSHKOSH

From Tuesday, August 13 to Friday, August 16, the Big Idaho® Potato Truck will be making an appearance at Oshkosh.

Originally built by Chris and Sharolyn Schofield of Weiser, Idaho with the help of a few specialized contractors, this truck weighs more than four tons (the equivalent of 21,562 mediumsized Idaho® potatoes) and is the world's largest potato on wheels. If this potato were real it would make over 20,217 servings of mashed potatoes, almost 1 million (970,380) French fries, and would weigh 802 times more than the largest potato ever grown, which clocked in at 11 pounds.

The Big Idaho® Potato Truck is currently on its eighth national tour. The tour began back in March and by the time it finishes the truck will have traveled approximately 25,000 miles and visited more than 60 cities. In fact, it has been the main attraction in several parades and festivals across the country including Thunder Over Louisville (KY); the National Memorial Day Parade in Washington, D.C., and NASCAR Poconos Raceway.

"The Big Idaho® Potato Truck has become the cornerstone of the Idaho Potato Commission's marketing program," explained Frank Muir, President & CEO, Idaho Potato Commission (IPC). "By promoting the truck in our national advertising campaign, participating in events with hundreds of thousands of attendees, and making stops at key retail

and foodservice operations, we've been able to engage millions of consumers of all ages across the country."

While on tour, the Big Idaho® Potato Truck has been helping dozens of charities with their charitable program, "A Big Helping." As they travel throughout the country, the Truck's management team identifies local charities to receive a \$500 donation via a Signature Board that's

set up at the events the Truck visits. In the past recipients have included food banks, children's hospitals and animal shelters.

ADRA to give away Humanitarian Pathfinder Pin at Oshkosh

Adventist Development and Relief Agency (ADRA), the faith-based international humanitarian arm of the Seventh-day Adventist Church, has created a one-of-a-kind humanitarian pin for Pathfinders to add to their uniforms. "ADRA's pin represents the problem that kids missing out on school is global—and so is the solution," said Matthew Siliga, vice president of marketing and development at ADRA.

Collecting pins has been a Pathfinder favorite since the camporee's start in 1985, and earning an ADRA pin will be a bonus for the more than 50,000 Pathfinders attending.


How to Earn the Pin



Tips from your Medical Team

- Please plan on 64 ounces of water each day for each person in your club.
 - Insist that every member of your club (adult and Pathfinder) drinks at least 16 ounces of water with each meal
- Please plan on having Gatorade or equivalent available for each person in your club to drink daily.
 - You can purchase Gatorade brand or Walmart brand powder that can be added to a water bottle easily.
- Volunteers—if you are coming just to volunteer please make sure that you have enough water and electrolyte supplement for yourself as well.
- 4. Make sure that you plan fiber in your meals at least once daily to help prevent abdominal pain and constipation.
- Instruct ALL adolescent females in your club to bring feminine hygiene products with them even if they think they won't need them. Our bodies change in large groups and when traveling.
- 6. Make sure that your club is prepared with minor medical supplies:
 - Bandaids
 - Tylenol
 - Advil
 - Others that you believe might be helpful
- Keep ALL medication in a secure place and instruct only adults to dispense
- 8. IF you have an emergency that you believe requires 9-1-1, Oshkosh Fire Department will be on the grounds from 11 a.m. to 11 p.m. and will respond to 9-1-1 calls. They will respond from their fire station during the remainder of the time.
- The medical building will be staffed 24/7 to provide care to any person needing medical attention at the Camporee. (Hours of operation subject to change as we get closer to the event.)
- 10. We are NOT a hospital. We are staffed with physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, nurses, paramedics and EMTs. We will provide the care that we are capable of and may refer you to the local Urgent Care or Hospital for more definitive care.
- 11. EVERYONE in your club must complete a medical information form. This includes volunteers, Pathfinders, all adult sponsors, and other family members who may be along.

- 12. If your club has its own form that is acceptable to use, otherwise please use the form that is on the website.
- 13. A medical information form must accompany any person who presents to the medical building for treatment.
- 14. You must bring a copy of your personal medical insurance and all clubs are expected to purchase insurance for the event through Risk Management. Information can be obtained on the website.
- 15. Medical teams will be roaming the grounds and at all events. The teams will be on golf carts and will assist with minor first aid/injury needs and/or transport to the medical building as necessary.
 - Please, Please, Please instruct your club to quickly move out of the way to allow for the golf carts and ambulance to safely move through the crowds as they are responding to an emergency. We do not want to create additional emergencies caused by moving vehicles.
- 16. The weather in Wisconsin can quickly change. Please bring clothing for all types of weather:
 - Cold
 - Hot
 - Rainy
 - Humid
 - Muddy
- 17. BRING TENNIS SHOES!!! You will be walking miles every day and you need to have shoes that are comfortable and that will not create blisters on your feet. This is NOT a fashion show. Flat dress shoes to wear when in uniform are expected. You do NOT want to wear heels for this much walking.
- 18. If you are on a two-way radio and you hear transmission that starts with "medical" do not interrupt the medical relay conversation until the call is completed.

Come to the 2019 Chosen International Pathfinder Camporee with a positive attitude, an open mind, a willing heart, and spirit of service. We have left a great impression on the community and we want to make it even better in 2019. CAMPOREE HYGIENE

General Hygiene

- Wash hands often throughout the day.
- Bring hand-cleaner or wet wipes for use before meals and after use of the portable toilets.
- Sneeze or cough into your shoulder rather than covering your face with a hand
- Each club, conference and union is to keep their ground clear of all trash (small or large) at all times.

Toilet Hygiene

- In this country, toilet seats are made to sit on, over the hole or water basin. Paper is used to wipe and put into the toilet. Do not squat on the floor or drop used paper on floor.
- Portable toilets (in rows outside) do not flush. Close the seat when done to keep flies out.
- Toilets in the shower houses must be emptied with water before you leave. Push down on the handle to flush. Always wash your hands at a basin before leaving the bathroom.
- Do not urinate or defecate anywhere other than the toilets. We all want to enjoy camp and leave healthy.

Shower Hygiene

- Showers are made for washing your body.
- Shower for less than five (5) minutes so all get a chance to be clean.
- Never use a shower as a toilet.
- Never use a shower to wash dishes or clothes.

Shower Supervision

- Help keep showers clean by leaving them cleaner than you find them.
 Cleaning personnel will clean down twice daily.
- To help everyone use showers efficiently, all Pathfinders must be accompanied and supervised by an adult staff to enter the shower facility.
- Any person who is already in line for a shower that needs to use the port-alet is to be allowed to return to their saved spot. Otherwise, no holding spots or cutting in line.
- Please report any bathroom cleaning concerns to the shower personnel who will be on duty from 6 a.m.-midnight at each facility.
- No RVs/camping facilities of any type are to be plugged into any shower facility.

NORMAS DE HIGIENE DEL CAMPOREE

Higiene General

- Lávese las manos durante el día.
- Traiga un desinfectante de manos o líquido antiséptico para usar antes de comer y después de usar los baños públicos.
- Estornude en su hombro en vez de cubrir su boca con su mano.
- Cada club, conferencia/asociación, y unión tiene que mantener su territorio limpio de basura (pequeña o grande) todo el tiempo.

Higiene para el baño

- En este país, los inodoros están diseñados para sentarse sobre la abertura (hueco). El papel higiénico se usa para limpiarse y después se tira en el inodoro. No se agache en el piso o tire papel higiénico usado en el piso.
- Los baños portátiles (en hilera afuera) no tienen manilla/manija para descargar los baños. Cierre la tapa cuando termine para que las moscas no salgan.
- Los inodoros que se encuentran en la casa de baño/duchas se tienen que vaciar con agua antes que se retire. Hay una manija/manilla que tiene que empujar. Siempre lávese las manos en el lavadero antes de salir del baño.
- No orine o defeque en ninguna parte excepto en el inodoro. Todos queremos disfrutar el campamento e irnos saludables.

Higiene de duchas

- Las duchas están diseñadas para lavar el cuerpo.
- Báñese en menos de cinco minutos para dar a todos la oportunidad de estar limpios.
- Nunca use la ducha como si fuera el inodoro.
- Nunca use las duchas para lavar ropa o platos de comer.

Supervisión de las duchas

- Deje la ducha mas limpia de como la encontró. Las personas encargadas limpiaran dos veces al día.
- Para el uso eficiente de las duchas, se le pide a todos los clubes que envíen sus conquistadores jóvenes acompañados por un adulto.
- Si una persona esta en línea para las duchas y necesita ir al baño, esta puede volver a su espacio reservado en la línea. En otras ocasiones, no se permite guardar espacios o cortar la línea.
- Reporte cualquier preocupación sobre la limpieza del baño a la persona a cargo que estarán sirviendo desde las 6:00a.m hasta las 12:00 de la noche en cada instalación.
- Ninguna clase de RV's o instalaciones para acampar se pueden conectar (enchufar) en ninguna de las casas de baño.

Serving Others with the Gift of Language

For Regiane (Anne) Hsu, one of the interpreters, this will be her first time attending Camporee. Anne is a teacher from Brazil who currently lives in China. She moved to China in 2011 to learn the Chinese language. Prior to moving there, she had been working as a Portuguese and English teacher in Brazil.

Once in China, Anne helped one of the churches there to start a Pathfinder club. In fact, that club is also here at Camporee

She loves interpreting and enjoys being used by God to serve others with the gift of language

for their first time. In 2013, Anne went back home to Brazil where she stayed until returning to China in 2016. One year later, Anne was invited to help start another Pathfinder club in Beijing for the international church. By the grace of God, that club is still having weekly activities.

When asked how she became involved

with interpreting Anne says, "Since my first contact with languages I just fell in love. I was in the 5th grade when I had English class for the first time. I used to translate songs on my own using my dictionary." Some of her other experiences with language have included studying English for her bachelor's degree, practicing other languages while in China, and working in Brazil as an interpreter for a Chinese company.

Anne is excited to be serving as an interpreter at Camporee. She loves interpreting and enjoys being used by God to serve others with the gift of language. She hopes that her interpreting will "give others a message that comes from God to touch their hearts and change their lives."

After Camporee, Anne will travel back to China where she will continue working as a quality content moderator for Microsoft. She plans to continue living in China for the next three to five years, and is hoping to get her master's degree while there.






